

ISMI UNDERGRADUATE TRAVEL AWARDS

Liebross-Mendelson Israel Enrichment Fund Award

PURPOSE

On the occasion of their wedding in August 2004, Joanna Liebross (2000C) and Lee Mendelson (1994C) established the Liebross-Mendelson Israel Enrichment Fund (LMIEF), honoring the fact that Israel and Emory brought them together. To foster an association with Israel, LMIEF aims at facilitating an Emory undergraduate's academic or work experience in Israel, typically for a summer, but where merit warrants it, a semester abroad in Israel.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Students must:

- Never have been to Israel;
- Be Emory College undergraduates;
- Have at least a 3.2 GPA as of fall 2007; and
- Return to Emory for at least one semester or more of study after the completion of the experience.

POST-EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Upon their return, recipients must:

- Submit to the selection committee a 1-page report of their experiences, within one month of returning from Israel;
- Deliver one public presentation about (or published account of) their experiences, at Emory or in their home communities, during their first semester back in the United States. This could be at a civic organization or religious institution, or in a classroom setting.

AWARD

Typically a grant of \$1,000 or more will be given to LMIEF grant recipients.

Maslin Enrichment Fund for Jewish Communal Association Award

PURPOSE

The Fund was established in 2005 by Kristy and Jon Maslin (1980C) through the Reitman Foundation, in order to facilitate undergraduate work, communal, or academic experiences for Emory students in the international Jewish community. The experience should last anywhere between 6 weeks and an entire semester. Examples of the types of experiences students might seek:

- A rising junior, majoring in sociology, who is interested in women's issues, might want to work for two months in a women's shelter in Jerusalem;
- A rising senior, a history or international studies major, might have the linguistic ability and character to work in a Jewish camp in Budapest;
- A pre-med student might want to intern in a medical laboratory in Tel Aviv;
- A student interested in public health might volunteer for a local health care facility in the Jewish community located in Lima, Peru.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Students must:

- Be Emory College undergraduates;
- Have at least a 3.2 GPA as of fall 2007; and
- Return to Emory for at least one semester or more of study after the completion of the program.

POST-EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Upon their return, recipients must:

- Submit to the selection committee a 2-page report of their experiences, within one month of returning;
- Deliver two public presentations about (or published accounts of) their experiences at Emory and/or in their home communities, during their first semester back in the United States. This could be at a civic organization or religious institution, or in a classroom setting.

AWARD

Typically a grant of up to \$3,000 will be given to pay for lodging, travel and related educational expenses.

These funds must be returned to ISMI within four weeks of cancellation or withdrawal. Furthermore, in the event that the post-experience requirements are not completed within six months of your return to Emory, you will incur a financial penalty of half your award amount.
